Parking at the rear of the hall / playschool is reserved for staff only. We have 28 staff members using that car park each day so all available spots are required.

# **Return to School Costs**

Back to school costs this summer were helped significantly due to the introduction of the new free schoolbook scheme. As noted in a previous correspondence in June, in what is a significant reduction compared to previous years, we will be asking for payment to cover the following:

- €10 (with the exception of Junior Infants) to cover additional costs for art materials / photocopying
- €8 for 24-Hour accident insurance from Allianz

The school financial year commenced on September 1st. Therefore, the payments above for the 2023/2024 school year are payable through the month of September. You will be provided with a link to Aladdin online payments. Cheque or cash payments are acceptable, but we encourage all parents/guardians to avail of our online payment option if possible. # Gaeilge

<u>Seachtain 4 – Go raibh maith agat (thank you). Tá fáilte romhat (you're welcome).</u>

Ceist coicíse: An maith leat? (do you like\_\_)Is maith liom/Ní maith liom (I like / I don't like)

#### Mobile Phones

Please refer to the Aladdin message sent to all parents on Monday September 4th with regard to pupils and mobile/smart phones. If you decide that your child is mature enough to deal with the consequences and responsibilities that come with owning a phone, we would advise you to monitor their usage closely. We would also strongly advise pupils to avoid large group chats, as per advice from outside experts and our own experiences. As mobile phones are not permitted on school grounds, children's online activity outside school hours is beyond our control. Should issues arise, we ask you in the first instance to have a family plan to deal with it. We have found in recent years that more and more out of school online behaviour is creeping into the school which negatively impacts teaching and learning, not to mention the effects on friendships.

#### Code of Behaviour

In recent years, we have implemented our new Code of Behaviour across the school. The feedback from staff, pupils and parents is that it's a very fair and clear document, and it allows the pupils to learn in a safe environment. Our traffic light system is predicated on our four basic school rules:

- 1. I have respect for people and for property.
- 2. I do my best in class and allow others to do the same.
- 3. I behave in a proper manner around the school.
- 4. I play safely and fairly.

At the beginning of another school year, we will familiarise the children with the rules once more and how our code of behaviour operates. Copies are available to download from the website. Our overarching aim is to promote positive behaviour and respect for one another.

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# Ploughing Championships / Late Opening

The local Garda Inspector has written to the school in advance of the National Ploughing Championships in Ratheniska on September 19th-21st. An Garda Síochana expect large volumes of traffic in the vicinity of our school and have asked us to delay our starting time on those mornings.

It is expected that normal traffic volumes will return after 10am so we will open at 10:15am on those mornings, with supervision starting from 10:05am. This decision is based on the advice we received from An Garda Síochana.
